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Kit Recycles Rimfire Empties for Centerfire Bullets

A new kit of tools for recycling fired .22 Short, Long, and Long Rifle cases and scrap lead into free .224 or .243 caliber centerfire bullets, using a conventional reloading press, is now available from Corbin Manufacturing & Supply, Inc., (PO Box 2659, White City, OR 97503).

The kit contains a "Rimfire Jacket Maker Die", which unfolds the head of the rimfire case and draws it into a closed-ended tube or cup, a "Core Mould" which turns soft scrap lead into any desired weight of lead of lead cylinders (four at a time, or about 1000 pieces per hour), a "Core Seat Die" to press the lead into the cups and form a precise, tightly assembled jacket pre-form, and a "Point Form Die" which produces a spitzer ogive nose on either the open end of the jacket pre-form (for an open tip or soft point bullet) or on the closed end (for a full metal jacket bullet). Also included is a supply of Corbin Swage Lube, to extend die life and reduce friction, and the "Corbin Handbook of Bullet Swaging".

Available in either .224 or .243 caliber, the kit can make 45-80 grain .224 bullets (50-65 grain is best for a .22 LR jacket) in open tip, lead tip, or full metal jacket style, or 60-100 grain bullets (60-65 grain is best for a .22 LR jacket), and can be used with commercial bullet jackets as well as the recycled rimfire cases. Price of the kit is \$349.50. Any standard single-station reloading press with a 7/8-14 threaded head and a ram that accepts RCBS shell holders can be used.
